




February 17th Featured Speaker Rae' Lee Klein

Rae'Lee Klein was born in Cheyenne Wyoming, where she was raised 'right' and taught the importance of conservative values. In 2018 she moved to Arizona to study journalism and political science at Arizona State University. During her final year she was fired from her position as Station Manager of the university's student radio station due to a tweet about Jacob Blake

that was "too conservative." Under the council of Phoenix attorney Jack Wilenchik, Klein sued ASU for free speech




violations, and won.

Upon graduating with both her bachelors in three years, Klein has become a free speech advocate and champion for young conservatives across the country. She hosts her own Podcast called 'Raised Right,' and works as Charlie Kirk's communications administrator in Phoenix. Klein was selected as the youngest member ever to join the Dodie Londen Excellence in Public Service program, and travels the country speaking to different clubs and organizations about the importance of standing up for our constitutional rights.

Question #1: How many candidate petitions can I sign per office?

Question #2: Must the candidate or their representative be present when I sign the petition?

Ballot access requirements for political candidates in Arizona


Signature requirements

Each signer of a nomination petition may sign <u>only one</u> <u>petition per office</u>, unless more than one candidate is to be elected for that office. In that case, <u>signers may sign as</u> <u>many nomination petitions as there are candidates that will be elected to the office.</u>

(Example: if there is one State Senate seat open voters can sign only one petition for that office, regardless of number of candidates running for the same office.

If there are two LD representative seats open, voters only can sign two petitions for that office regardless of how many candidates are





running for those two offices.)

Circulation requirements


All petitions must be signed by the circulator who circulated them, and the circulator's name should be printed or typed beneath his or her signature. The circulator's residence address should also be included on the petition. If a circulator is not a resident of the state, he or she must register with the Arizona Secretary of State.

A circulator must verify that every name on the petition was signed in his or her presence on the date indicated and that, to the best of the circulator's knowledge, each signer was a qualified elector living at the residence address given.

(Example: The candidate or their representative must stay with the petitions during the signing process and attest that they witnessed the signing after asking if the person is qualified to sign)

In our 2nd year, Ways and Means is now developing plans for 2022. In addition to the usual raffles at our meetings starting with our February meeting......




Also this year, I would like to develop some GMRW logo merchandise. I would like to spend some time gaining outside vendors to sell items that our members would love.

Facts About the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier


Thanks to a too-good-to-pass-up invitation in 2018 from my very generous Prescott friends Cathy and Dan Spero, I got to make my first trip to Washington, D.C., that summer. Among the many spectacular historic sites we visited, none was more inspiring than the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery.

Here are some facts I recently read. I'm sure there are smarties among you who know some of these things, maybe all of them. But at least several of them were new to me.

After the initial interment in 1921 of an unknown soldier who died during World War I, three more soldiers have been added to the Tomb, and one has been disinterred.

There were four unknown soldier candidates for the World War I crypt. The honoree from World War II was chosen from two candidates. There were four potential representatives from the





Korean War. And owing to mitochondrial DNA testing, the unknown soldier from the Vietnam War wasn't unknown for long. In 1998 he was identified by scientists as Air Force 1st Lt. Michael Joseph Blassie, who was disinterred after his identification.

The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier has been guarded around the clock since 1937. Tomb Guards come from the 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment, also known as "The Old Guard." Serving since 1784, the Old Guard is the oldest active infantry unit in the military. They keep watch over the memorial every minute of every day, even when the cemetery is closed and in inclement weather.

Everything the guards do is related to the number 21, honoring the 21-gun salute -- for instance, taking 21 steps, then stopping for 21 seconds before turning to walk the 21 steps in the other direction down the mat.

Becoming a Tomb Guard is not easy. Members of the Old Guard must apply for the position. If chosen, training is intense, requiring the passing of tests on weapons, ceremonial steps, cadence, military bearing, uniform preparation, and orders, among other difficult tasks in memorization and stamina.

Guards "walk the mat" in front of the tomb in shifts ranging from 30 minutes to two hours. They remain on site for 24 hours at a time, and when they aren't walking the mat they're in the living quarters beneath it. Preparation of a Guard's uniform can take a





Guard up to 8 hours. Tomb Guards serve for an average of 18 months.

The Tomb Guard badge is the least awarded badge in the Army, and the next least awarded in the military overall, second only to the Astronaut badge. Tomb Guards are held to the highest standards of behavior, both on and off the job. Their badge can be taken away for any action that could bring disrespect to the tomb, and that applies throughout the Guard's lifetime, even long after he has "retired" from the position. Six women have held the post.

Guards perform their Guard duty without displaying their rank. This is done to avoid the possibility of outranking the soldiers whose remains they are watching over.




It is my great honor to serve as your newly elected AzFRW Region I Director for 2022-23.

I would like to encourage members of each club to support other clubs in your region, as well as all Chartered Republican Women's Club.





The AzFRW Winter meeting will be held in Tucson on February 24-26!


