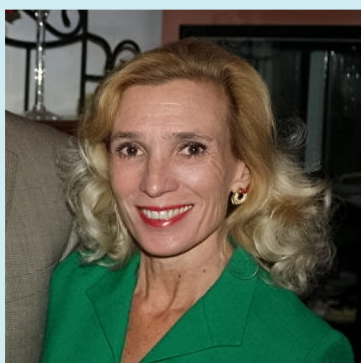

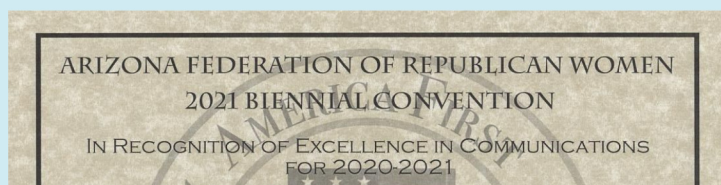
The theme of the convention, “America First”, solidified the idea of putting freedom, national security, and opportunity first. Speakers

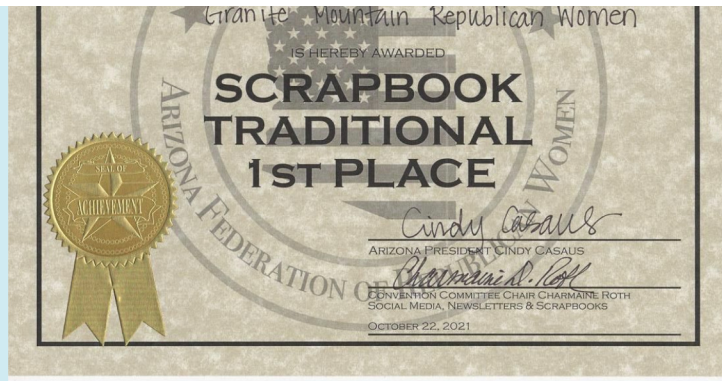

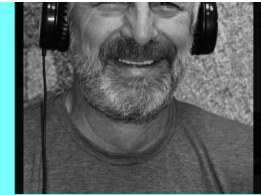

Proven! Life Imitates Art What's Behind the Media Culture Changing America



Sanford Cohen, along with his wife Terry, own and operate nine radio stations here in Arizona. KPPV, the Mix/Your At-Work Station on 106.7 FM, KQNA 1130 AM/99.9 FM and 95.5 FM, News Talk – Sports featuring Dennis Prager, Ben Shapiro, Mark Levin, Sebastian Gorka and Brian Kilmeade plus local talk shows as well. The group also has “Cattle Country” 94.3 KDDL, 94.7 Jack FM and 107.1 The Juan, and only Spanish radio station in Northern Arizona.

The Cohens also operate three stations in Lake Havasu City and TravelRadio at the Grand Canyon, the only commercial radio station at the canyon.

Beginning in 1985 with their first station, the Cohens developed the first solar powered FM radio station in the United States on top of Glassford Hill. The couple was named innovative advocates for 1987 by the SBA and received a special citation from the U.S. Secretary of Energy.

Sanford’s stations are always focused on the communities they serve. Arizona’s Hometown Radio Group is a member of 10 Arizona local chambers of commerce.

Starting with one station and now with nine, this year, the Cohens celebrate 36 years of broadcasting in Arizona. Sanford started his career doing the morning announcements in Junior High School. Clearly this was his chosen profession.

He is a former chair of the Prescott Chamber Board, former President of the Prescott Valley Chamber Board, on the boards of several other volunteer organizations and as President of the Downtown Prescott Association for 12 years; he presided over the

financing, construction and planning for the downtown parking garage

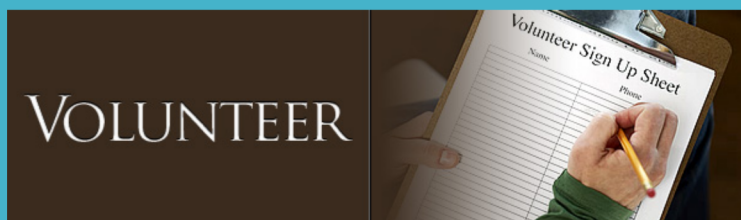

Republican or Independent?

As our country awakened from our decades long slumber, there has certainly been disillusionment. "We the People" realized that some of our elected officials are heroes, but some have not had the interests of We the People in mind. Subsequently, some conservatives have labeled the Republican Party an enemy, and rather than separating the wheat from the chaff, they have moved to other parties. I've been asked how I would respond to someone who has walked away from the Republican Party.

On January 6th, I experienced my own epiphany: no one will save us but ourselves. Everyone had held the hope that, at the last moment, Trump would work a miracle. Didn't happen, did it? But the miracle that DID happen is that Americans realized that living in a Democratic Republic is not a passive activity. People became politically active and involved. Some felt betrayed by the Republican Party and they left for other start-up parties. Doesn't that make sense? If the Republican Party doesn't do what you want, leave?

So why not just throw in the towel and move on to volunteer with another grassroots party? I thought seriously about it, myself. So seriously that I made a mental list of what would be required for a third party to take our country back. First, that party would need a HUGE grassroots organization, across the country, for an effective ground game. Winning a National election requires ads, collateral materials, travel, polls, venues, consultants, etc. Not cheap. How likely is it that a third party can win? The most likely result is a split of Conservative votes, leading to a Liberal win. Remember how that gave us Bill Clinton? In addition, how much can a small, independent party do to resolve election fraud issues? It takes more than good intent.

There is another option, however. Reform the party from within. The Republican Party is designed to work from the grassroots up. When the local people get involved by volunteering as a Precinct Committeeman (PC), they become the basis of a powerful voting bloc. Those local, Conservative Republican grassroots volunteers select other Conservative Republican PCs as Delegates. Those Delegates attend the State Conventions and the National Conventions to elect our Party's Officers, and even help establish the Party Platform. Trump Make America Great Again.**

Ultimately, the LOCAL Republican Party members select our Republican leaders. We the People are responsible for what our Party does, and YOU CAN make the difference.

Those Independent Political Parties do have their place. They can motivate people and disseminate important information. But our Democratic Republic is a huge ship to move, unless you move it from within, at the wheel of that huge ship. NO, it's not perfect but, as Regan said, "My 80% friend is not my 20% enemy".

If you, like many others, want to discuss a decision to work exclusively with a third party, keep in mind that first, you need to engage with authentic, curious questions. Your honest intent to understand is essential. No "conversion" takes place without an honest, non-combative conversation to engage and understand. That way, you can still be friends!

Either way, get involved in the Political Process. The future of America is in the balance. Don't leave it up to others to determine YOUR future.

The Language of the Founders



According to constitutional law professor Robert Natelson, both the

Constitution and Bill of Rights are chock full of words and phrases “inherited from England.” This fact is crucial to understanding the meaning and significance of our founding documents. Of particular importance is that our universities’ and political leaders’ propensity to downplay and ignore this reality is to subject our founding principles to the misguided notion of a “living, breathing Constitution,” to the “diversity” agenda, and to “woke” propaganda.

Professor Natelson posits that *some* of the Constitution’s language was ordinary language for the founding generation, who were heavily influenced by the English political and legal system. The truth is that many of them had worked and studied within these systems. But much of the Constitution’s language wasn’t ordinary at all, even in 1787, owing to the fact that the Constitution is a legal document as well as an outline of government. Hence the framers inserted words and phrases with *specialized* legal and political meanings.

During the ratification debates the framers carefully explained these words and phrases to the general public, as evidenced by numerous transcripts of their meetings, correspondence between the framers, and the Federalist Papers that were published in the media of the era specifically for the purpose of educating the public.

Just a few examples of words and phrases found in the Constitution that had specialized political or legal meanings are:

Advice and consent, establishment of religion, general welfare, high crimes and misdemeanors, impeachment, natural born, necessary and proper, regulation of commerce, and well-regulated militia, among many others.

It would be to our nation’s great benefit for students, and all American citizens, to understand the language origins of our Constitution and what the framers intended when they created the document.

A Note from Jan Baron

“It pays to complain” my mother used to say. She wrote letters to the Editor of the local newspaper, the City Council, Consumer Affairs and sometimes they listened and sometimes it made a difference. Do nothing and nothing will happen.

Concerned citizens in the Prescott area have been complaining to the Board of Directors at our local hospital (YRMC) about the unconstitutional vaccine mandates for our healthcare workers. We have been holding rallies every Sunday at 1:00 pm since August 8 in support of those who wish to exercise their freedom of choice regarding their personal health.

And our voice was heard! On October 7, the CEO of YRMC announced that although the mandate has not been lifted, the deadline has been moved from November 1 to February 1, 2022.

I believe that our support gave the healthcare workers the strength to stick together and not give in to the mandates. When management saw that the unvaccinated were not going to change their position, and that they could not possibly replace all these well qualified professionals, they had to come up with a different plan.

Let's pray that more facts will come out about the dangers of the vaccine before the next deadline that will prompt them to withdraw their mandate altogether.

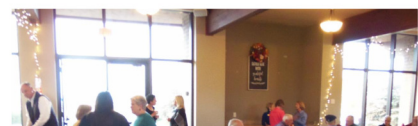
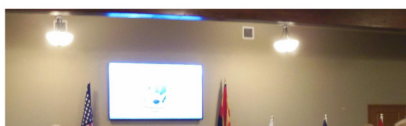
