Has America lost its mind?

Let's face it, no one wants to be called intolerant or closed-minded. But for most of American history standards of acceptable behavior were generally agreed upon. Today we can't even agree on the difference between a man and a woman. As a society do we need to tolerate every crack pot view no matter how harmful, no matter how false? Of course not, but the progressive left seem dead set on unsettling every settled question, all in the name of being open minded, and increasingly I believe a purposeful intent to destroy our constitutional republic.

Every citizen has an obligation to follow the law even if they don't want to.... even if a person "identifies" as a serial killer. In another example if we say 'yes' to tolerating drag queen story hour, then we are refusing to tolerate the wishes of taxpayers and parents who don't want their public property used in drag shows for kids. So, the question that divides us is not whether every public behavior must be tolerated but which public behaviors should be tolerated and which should not?

Until relatively recently we once had community standards and respect for the equal application of justice. Of course, not everything done in the past was good or to be preserved into the future. For centuries, slavery was commonplace but it wasn't good. But tradition is the anchor that helps us discern the good. It shows us the wisdom of the ages. This discernment of the good led us to abolish slavery. Even though some of our founding fathers owned slaves, they knew it was wrong. Their belief in the biblical idea that all men are created equal in the eyes of God helped guide the country toward abolition.

In summary, if we wish to overturn social norms, the burden of proof that these radical changes will make things better, should be on the revolutionaries of the radical left, not on the defenders of tradition.....the conservatives. As defenders of tradition and values, we have over 3,000 years of history including the Bible, the Magna Carta, English common law, the American Constitution and the Gettysburg Address to guide us. The choice is clear....we must stand firm and fight for the traditions and values that made our country the greatest nation on earth!

NFRW & AzFRW Pat Lorenzen AzFRW Region I Director



The Region I Clubs were well represented at the September AzFRW meeting in Chandler. We had wonderful speakers, workshops and Breakouts. Of special interest was the **Breakout: What's On Your Ballot? Initiatives and Propositions.** Speakers were from The Arizona Free Enterprise Club and The Goldwater Institute along with AZ State Senator, JD Mesnard. Shown below is the handout from the breakout session. Keep in mind, where you see "no position" it just means

that the AZ Free Enterprise Club has no position. These 2 proposed amendments were discussed and positions were suggested. (See notes in red)

First, it's good to refresh our memories on what the numbers of propositions mean:

- Props numbered with "100" # are Constitutional Amendments.
- Props numbered with "200" and "300" # are proposed laws.

200 = Citizen measures

300 = Legislature measures

Proposed Laws



Allows individuals here illegally to receive taxpayer subsidized tuition at our universities.



Is the Arizonans for Voter ID Act ensuring all in-person voters show valid, government issued photo ID and creates ID requirements for voting by mail.

PROP 310 XVOTE NO

Increases the statewide sales tax by 0.1% resulting in a nearly \$200 million tax increase to fund fire districts statewide.

PROP 131 (NO POSITION) *VOTE YES!

Creates the office of the Lieutenant Governor, who would run on the same ticket as the Governor and would take over existing powers within the state government, such as running the Department of Administration. Avoid having split party representation

PROP 132



Requires any new tax or tax increase on the ballot to receive at least 60% of the vote to pass.

Proposed Laws

PROP 308 XVOTE NO

Allows individuals here illegally to receive taxpayer subsidized tuition at our universities.

PROP 309 VOTE YES

Is the Arizonans for Voter ID Act ensuring all in-person voters show valid, government issued photo ID and creates ID requirements for voting by mail

TO GIVE OF CALCO TO TOQUITOTIES FOR YOUNG BY ITIGHT.

PROP 310 XVOTE NO

Increases the statewide sales tax by 0.1% resulting in a nearly \$200 million tax increase to fund fire districts statewide.

PROP 209 XVOTE NO

Excuses people from having to pay their debt which will increase inflation, make it harder to access credit, and shift the burden to the taxpayers who do pay their bills. *Note: Has little to with medical debt, but all debt and undermines contract law.

Supported by CA unions. - Bad for economy!

PROP 211 XVOTE NO

Requires private organizations to disclose donors to the government if they spend more than a certain amount in any given election, violating the constitutional right to privacy and association.

*Note: This is an invasion of privacy, tramples free speach and donors rights. Allows the weponizing of private information. Big Tech is exempt!


